Pike County Flood 2010: Disaster Assistance Needed!

Many communities in Pike County have been devastated by the flooding on Saturday, July 17th. Early reports of flash flooding have confirmed two dead, 10,000 without water, 200 homes damaged or washed away, 100 cars destroyed, and numerous roads and bridges washed out.

Transylvania Presbytery has been contacted by Rev. Clem Street of First Presbyterian Church in Pikeville for assistance for their community. We have contacted the Presbyterian Disaster Assistance office in Louisville and have secured an initial \$10,000 grant to assist the Pikeville Church in their efforts. The Pikeville Church is currently acting as a drop-off location for donations of non-perishable food items, water, clothing, and cleaning supplies.

The Presbytery is requesting your help for our friends, family, and neighbors in Pikeville. Here is a list of things needed immediately:

- * cleaning supplies of all kinds
 - * non-perishable food items
 - * blankets, sheets, pillowcases
 - * towels, wash cloths, and soap
 - * underwear and socks (all sizes)
 - * monetary donations are always acceptable
